# Gunning for Obama

JONATHAN FARLEY puts forth a modest proposal as to how US liberals can resist the gun-nuts



**A**T A recent public discussion about health insurance with US President Barack Obama, a New Hampshire man with a gun strapped to his leg waved a sign saying: "It is time to water the tree of liberty" — a reference to a quote by Thomas Jefferson that finishes: "With the blood of patriots and tyrants."

When asked by a reporter if the gun was loaded, the man, William Kostric, laughed.

"Wow," he said. "Who would be silly enough to carry an unloaded firearm?"




